

**FROM THE RABBI ...  
Sandford R. Kopnick**

**LAUGHTER AT SERVICES?**

Whoever said that laughter is the best medicine was on to something. As a rabbi, I have been blessed with a front-row seat at some of life's extraordinary moments. Truth be told, very few life-cycle events are without a humorous moment. And while a profound sense of spirituality evokes great feelings, laughter is not among them. So, why laugh at services sometimes?

Our Jewish worship service is intended for community building. The concept of a minyan (Jewish prayer quorum) requires a minimum of ten souls before it is considered valid. Some enter our midst with profound sorrow, others with a need to be with others, and some just looking for perspective on a hectic week.

As one of the people charged with helping to create our worship experience, I know that the music is very important for a sense of spirituality, and the prayer book's job is to structure our time together to cover prayers of praise to God which link us to Jews throughout the world. We pray for healing, we remember our departed, and we reflect on the miraculous history of our people and of humanity which helps us find our place in God's world.

Laughter at services isn't usually planned. It generally comes from very human moments. Sometimes, there is a Torah interpretation that is bizarre enough to evoke a smile. A mistakenly spoken word, or a wrong note can create a spontaneous comment that can defuse an awkward moment. An intensely emotional moment can be softened with a giggle. And sometimes, a story that relates the Torah to our all too human moments is funny because it is so true and relevant to us.

If we laugh with each other, it may be easier to cry with each other when need be. If we remember that our lives are increasingly less formal, then a light moment at services should allow services to feel more a part of our week.

Make no mistake, laughter does not mean the absence of the sacred. On the contrary. It would be one thing if stand-up comedy replaced our service, or a sarcastic comment, while funny to some, was at another's expense. But just as music sets a tone, a service that allows for us to really be together with joy and sorrow, serious Torah learning, while having the ability to laugh at ourselves and our world, can all balance for good community building. Your attendance in our community prayer matters and helps.

There is no law against enjoying our service—celebrating each other, and marking the sacred—sometimes with a tear, and sometimes with a smile.


## STARK FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN RELIGIOUS SCHOOL?

It has been a wonderful year in Religious School. Rabbi Kopnick, Carolan Glatstein, our rabbinic intern, the teachers, madrichim (high school aged teaching assistants) and I collaborate to create a meaningful Jewish experience on Sunday mornings and Tuesday nights. Your children's interests and abilities are important to us and we consider those when we plan for interactions with Torah, Hebrew, Jewish values, Jewish wisdom, Jewish stories, Jewish history, Jewish holidays, art and music. We have special guests like musicians, storytellers, authors and puppeteers. The Chaverim M'Israel (young Israeli emissaries) visit our school and accompany our students on retreats.

### **Here are some ways to keep learning over the summer:**

**Explore Jewish books.** Two of my favorite sites to find titles are: [www.jewishlibraries.org](http://www.jewishlibraries.org) (click on publications and Jewish Values Finder) and <http://www.SydneyTaylorBookAward.org>.

**Take a break from the heat to play a game or practice Hebrew with this free online resource:** Go <http://www.behrmanhouse.com> and click on Families for an outstanding site filled with games, holiday resources, and lots and lots of Hebrew practice. You will have to register an email address, but the site is absolutely free. We use Behrman House's *Hineni* series in our Hebrew program, so your kids can practice over the summer by clicking on Hineni 1 for 4<sup>th</sup> grade, Hineni 2 for 5<sup>th</sup> grade or Hineni 3 for 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Parents, you can brush up too!

**Include Jewish reading in your bedtime ritual.** Here are some books (for both adults and kids) that can help: *The Torah: A Modern Commentary* W.G. Plaut, ed., *The Torah: A Women's Commentary* Tamara Cohn Eskenazi and Andrea L. Weiss, eds., *The Bedside Torah: Wisdom, Visions, and Dreams* by Rabbi Bradley Shavit Artson, *God's Garden: Children's Stories Grown from the Bible* by Adam Fisher. *Jewish Values from Alef to Tav: A Value Story for Every Letter of the Hebrew Alphabet* by Joel Lurie Grishaver

**Come to Tot Shabbat and Family Services!** This is a great way to worship and connect with your Valley friends, to practice your Hebrew, to sing along with the songs you know from the past, songs your children learn in Religious School, and to learn new ones together!

Have a fantastic summer. I am here to answer any questions, to provide you with any materials you may need during the break, or if you need a hug and a reminder of how wonderful you and your children are!

This coming fall, there is much to look forward to as we dedicate the year to interfaith studies and relationship building within the Cincinnati community. In past years this course has inspired new friendships, strengthened existing ones, and fostered a deeper appreciation of Judaism.

The other exciting news from the youth program is our election of a leadership board, with Josh Weikel serving as president. Mazel tov to Josh and the leadership think tank that will nurture informal Jewish education, bond building, and friend making. I'm very proud of the youth group this year who organized and beautifully executed a Purim carnival that raised funds and spirits.

Valley Temple is truly a unique place: one that springs into action at a moment's notice, one that is quick to embrace one another and Jewish values. Within Valley, there is an entire youth community who are learning from the greater congregation how to function on their own, to dream big, give generously, and make our Jewish future very bright indeed.

I am honored to be a part of both of these communities, and am grateful for your support and feedback. I look forward to our new term in the fall when our adventure resumes.
