# FROM THE RABBI ... Sandford R. Kopnick

#### IN MEMORY OF ARIEL SHARON ...

Ariel Sharon died last month. He was in a coma as a result of a stroke for eight years. Eight years! His family interpreted our tradition very conservatively, and determined that it was inappropriate to remove the life-supports that artificially kept him breathing, but held no promise for any type of recovery. Prime Minister Sharon's life was over eight years ago. And he was buried quickly after his breathing stopped last month.

I respect Mr. Sharon's family and their interpretation of our tradition. But I do not agree with it. As I understand our tradition, we are not to hasten death, nor are we required to get in the way of death occurring. My understanding of Mr. Sharon's stroke, and his subsequent hospitalization led me to understand that the life-support machines stood in the way of his death. The machines were not therapeutic or medicinal, they were in the way of allowing a terminal patient (truly one on his death bed) to die.

It is my hope that Mr. Sharon's family understood the Prime Minister's end-of-life wishes and adhered to them. It is my fervent prayer that you all consider what you would hope your family would do in a similar situation, and discuss it with them. It would be even better if you were certain to have a legal *health-care power of attorney* and *advance directives* in writing.

The gift you give your family is immeasurable. If your wishes are clearly known and are in writing, then family members are much less likely to fight about protecting your wishes. Discussion will focus on how to best carry out your wishes, rather than determining what they actually are.

Ariel Sharon was one of the last Israeli pioneers to be buried. He did many things in his life that I do not respect, and many things in his life that I find inspirational. Regardless of politics, I feel profound sympathy and sadness for Mr. Sharon's family—for they were unable to find their way to allowing their father and grandfather to naturally die. I believe that it is not a stretch, nor a "liberal" idea that life-supports can be removed. My understanding of the sources from our tradition makes it clear that if the doctors determine someone to be brain-dead, life-support is not only allowed to be removed, but encouraged.

Be certain to discuss your wishes with loved ones. Write it down in a way that makes it very difficult to wonder what you want at life's end. And by all means, do everything you can to live a life worthy of God's blessing—so that whenever we are faced with a world in which we rely on our memories of your life, they are filled with inspiration of how you were in your highest moments.

When I was revisiting one of my favorite books about schools, I was struck by the passage above. Since my mind tumbles with thoughts of *Jewish* education, I immediately inserted the word, Jewish, in front of 'experiences' and 'lives.' During each session that you bring your children to us, our teachers try to create exactly the types of experiences Delpit recommends. We hope to spark their imaginations, build on their feelings of connectedness not only to their heritages within your families, but also to their Valley family, and to a Jewish world outside the doors of home and temple.

By the time you read this, you will have received progress reports for the first semester. The progress report is designed to give you a small glimpse into the classroom experiences your children are having. Family Education sessions give you a chance to see your children in action and to learn alongside them. Communication with your children's teachers can help more. Please contact me or your child's teacher directly to discuss any concerns or to share any tips that work at home or at secular school.
