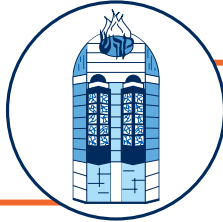

**FROM THE RABBI ...**  
**Sandford R. Kopnick**

**STANDING AT SINAI...AGAIN!**

Shavuot is a holiday that commemorates the giving of Torah to our people on Mt. Sinai. In synagogues all over the world (including ours), Jews will read the Exodus version of the Ten Commandments to help us travel back to that moment.

No matter what we believe about the Torah's authorship or its Divinity, the story is powerful. Our people, downtrodden from slavery stand as one to receive the revelation at Mt. Sinai. Whether you are taken with the "community's unity" aspect of the story, or the idea that our communal covenant with God began at the moment we commemorate, there is a profound significance in that event.

Recently, our 12th grade students stood before our congregation to proclaim their connection to their people, each other, their families, and our God. This moment of Confirmation was a particularly meaningful moment. There is something so profound in seeing our seniors, on the cusp of taking their next step into adulthood, speaking to us from the bimah to proclaim their faith and their religious intentions.

Josh, Adam, Matt, and Alex were joined in recent years by Zoe—and the five of them relayed their experiences—of trips to Israel, b'nai mitzvah, Mitzvah Corps with Marshal (our intern at the time), the Washington D.C. trip, Kulanu, and more. Whether new to the congregation or a veteran, our students expressed their Jewish identities in ways that transformed our Valley Temple Bimah to Mt. Sinai, and we were all there, again.

I am so thankful for Alison Weikel, our talented religious school faculty, and the entire congregation who help educate our children, give them rich and varied experiences, and help insure that our Valley Temple is always positioned to embrace our children as we embrace each other.

It is difficult to say l'hitraot (until we meet again) to our seniors, but we must. Thankfully, the classes that follow have unique personalities and new mountains to climb. With God's help (and yours), we'll stand at the foot, again, and listen for God's voice.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN RELIGIOUS SCHOOL?

I am somewhat of a creature of habit. Nine times out of ten, while I am driving to Valley, I play the same playlist from my iPod. But recently, on a day that I did not plug my iPod into my car stereo, the radio sang me to work, and I heard a song that caught my attention. This is not a new song, and it may not even be a popular song, but as I was listening to "Nothing More" by the Alternate Routes, I had a familiar experience. I thought, "What a Jewish song!" I often find myself relating everyday stories, songs, and experiences to Judaism. It's a job hazard. I do it all the time.

"Nothing More" is technically not a Jewish song and I could not figure out if any of the songwriters or band members are Jewish. (I tried to find out!) But in my world, a world in which I am always contemplating the relevance of supplementary Jewish education, this song struck me. One line jumped out at me like a refrain I repeated in my head as I reflected on each session of Religious School. "We are how we treat each other and nothing more."

How is this Jewish? Well, the first connection that came to me is from Pirkei Avot 1:2 (Ethics of Our Fathers) and we sing it when we take the Torah from the ark each Shabbat: Al Sh'losha d'varim ha-olam omeid: al ha-Torah, v'al ha-Avodah, v'al Gemitut Chasadim. The world stands upon three things: on Torah, and on Divine Service, and on acts of loving kindness. Acts of loving kindness... how we treat each other.

The world in which we live categorizes religious education as optional. You choose to engage in temple life and to share your children with us. It is our job to help them make meaning from Torah, from our traditions, our stories, and the Hebrew language. But we do not do this in isolation. We do this as a community, in relationships with each other. Our teachers seek to co-create learning communities and your children are a vital part of the creation and the evolution and growth of the communities. There is Jewish content in the classroom to be sure. There are holidays and text studies, and prophets and mitzvot. There is Jewish history, prayerbook Hebrew, life cycle studies, and the Holocaust. But the

meaning-making comes when children and adults feel that it matters to them. And that feeling is more likely to emerge when they are invested in the people around them in the room -- the teacher and their classmates. It is more likely to happen when we are invested in each other and the content, and therefore, how we treat each other matters.

My wish for you this summer is to find some time to read and listen to music, some time to relax, some time to enjoy family and friends, and some time to think about what's Jewish about everything you do. I will be thinking about how to continue to facilitate the kind of learning community where how we treat each other matters. I am here when you'd like to chat and the library is always open so you can borrow some books. Let me know if you need a recommendation. And whatever you decide to do this summer, however you decide to spend your time, I hope you think about how we treat each other and about what makes that Jewish.
