## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN RELIGIOUS SCHOOL?

I recently took some time to study Talmud with my peers (other members of the Cincinnati Jewish Educators Council) and I want to share this text with you:

Rabbi Tarfun and some elders were reclining in an upper chamber in the house of Nitza in Lod when this question came up: Which is greater, study or action? Rabbi Tarfon spoke up and said: Action is greater. Rabbi Akiva spoke up and said: Study is greater. The others then spoke up and said: Study is greater because it leads to action. (Babylonian Talmud, Kidushin, 40B)

I encourage you and your children to both study and DO over the summer. Are you visiting a relative who is in the hospital? Bringing a meal to a friend who is overwhelmed? Inviting someone who doesn't often get invited by others to play with you? Find ways to point out what's Jewish about what you are doing.

Here are some ways to keep learning over the summer. And perhaps your study will lead to action!

### *Explore Jewish books.*

**PJ Library!** If you have a child under the age of 8, you can subscribe to receive a Jewish book in your mailbox every month for FREE (thanks to our Cincinnati Jewish community and the Grinspoon Foundation). Go here to sign up: <http://pjlibrary.org/parents-and-families/enrollment.aspx>

You can also use the PJ Library site to find books on Jewish holidays and topics.

One of my favorite sites to find titles is: [www.jewishlibraries.org](http://www.jewishlibraries.org) Click on Jewish Values Finder on the left side to search for a book on a specific topic like *tzedakah* or *feeding the hungry*. Also look at the Awards section. The Sydney Taylor Book Award is an annual award given for outstanding children's books that authentically portray the Jewish experience. I will also be sending some summer book suggestions when I send progress reports for the second semester.

*Take a break from the heat to play a game or practice Hebrew with this free online resource:* Go <http://www.behrmanhouse.com> and click on Students for an outstanding site filled with games, holiday resources, and lots and lots of Hebrew practice. You will have to register an email address, but the site is absolutely free. We use Behrman House's *Hineni* series in our Hebrew program, so your kids can practice over the summer by clicking on Hineni 1 for 4<sup>th</sup> grade, Hineni 2 for 5<sup>th</sup> grade or Hineni 3 for 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Parents, you can brush up too!

*Keep up with the weekly Torah portion.* Come to Torah Study with Rabbi Kopnick, Brian Nelson and your Valley friends... We will be at the Temple on Saturdays at 9:30 AM until June 13. Then, we will be at HUC's Mayerson Hall for the rest of June, July and August 1st. No experience

necessary. It is fascinating to read and interpret the words of our People.

Short on time? Try <http://www.thetorahinhaiku.com/> 17 syllables a week on the parsha (portion). Sign up for the Union for Reform Judaism's weekly email, 10 Minutes of Torah at <http://urj.org/torah/ten/> or check out the Family Resources at <http://urj.org/life/family/> Other sites to visit are <http://www.aish.com> for stories and coloring pages for each portion and [www.g-dcast.com](http://www.g-dcast.com) which offers a 3-5 minute cartoon retelling of the weekly portion.

Stay tuned over email and on our website to see where we will be over the summer. We will worship at HUC's Mayerson Hall beginning June 19 due to our exciting construction project... Shabbat worship is a great way to connect with your Valley friends, to practice your Hebrew, to sing along with the songs you know from the past, songs your children learn in Religious School, and to learn new ones together!

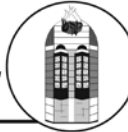
