## From the Rabbi Sandford R. Kopnick

### WHY TORAH COVERS?

There is a phrase from our tradition: "Without sustenance, there is no Torah." (Avot 3:14). During the Shabbat Service on Friday, February 6, we will dedicate three new Torah Covers which will adorn our Ark for at least a generation. Each cover will have the inscription "in loving memory of Wendy Walsh" inside—touching the scrolls. Not only did we need new Torah covers, but it was a natural way to honor Wendy's memory and her 44 years of service to our congregation.

I was surprised that there was criticism about this choice—but after some reflection, it made sense. Wendy's mission in our congregation was to be sure that Sol and I (and Austin) had all that we needed to deliver Torah to the congregation. Her work in the "sustenance" parts of Valley (ie billing, building and grounds, administration, etc.) facilitated Torah (ie. services, religious school, adult ed, celebrations, holiday observances, etc.). Without sustenance, there is no Torah.

Frankly, I love the fact that Wendy's memory will be triggered whenever someone eats a piece of carrot cake, thinks about a scrapbook, sees her remarkable family, and whenever they send something back in a restaurant that didn't get an order right. But I believe that Wendy's work in our congregation facilitated many successful initiatives for learning, innovation in worship, adult learning opportunities, trips to Israel, holiday commemorations, and creativity that could have never happened absent her orchestrating the logistics. Without her behind-the-scenes support, the programs would have been lesser. And to memorialize that herculean and consistent effort with a special space in our sanctuary---well it seems to be the highest honor. In addition, we needed these new covers—and she would have loved the practicality that comes with the honor.

I am positive that Wendy would have been both surprised and very touched by the way we are choosing to memorialize her presence with us. Your ongoing connection to Valley, your care for Kelli and Amanda in the office during these months of mourning and transition, and your participation in creating this tribute are all additional ways we are making the memory of the righteous to be for a blessing. I look forward to seeing you on February 6 as we remember this wonderful friend and facilitator of Torah.

## Rabbi/Educator's Message Austin Zoot

Last month, a congregant approached me after services. They mentioned that, during my sermons, I frequently make references to books I'm reading and resources that I consult when I am preparing. They asked if I might share a reading list of my recommendations for works that would benefit someone who wants to learn more. So that's what we're going to do here! These are five suggestions for books that might interest you if you want to deepen your Jewish knowledge or engage in intriguing Jewish conversation. These are just five of my favorites; if you enjoy this and want more suggestions, I'm always happy to talk books!

### 1. *God Is Here: Reimagining the Divine* by Rabbi Toba Spitzer

Talking about God makes a lot of people uncomfortable. Which is why Rabbi Spitzer's book is so powerful; it teaches people how to talk about God as well as how to take ownership of our own imaginations about God. Deeply rooted in Jewish texts, Spitzer gives a whole new access to theology that is a powerful tool for Jews finding their way.

### 2. *The Second Mountain: The Quest for a Moral Life* by David Brooks

From school to career to retirement, there is a very clearly laid out path for what a person "should" do. But David Brooks examines what happens when we make huge accomplishments, only to find we are missing the fulfillment we were promised along the way. The Second Mountain is a poignant reminder of what it means to prioritize the right parts of life, and how we can all strive for something larger than personal achievement.

### 3. *As a Jew: Reclaiming Our Story From Those Who Blame, Shame, and Try To Erase Us* by Sarah Hurwitz

As American Jews, many of us know all too well what it feels like to assess our tradition through the lens of a

Christian-dominant culture. Former speechwriter Sarah Hurwitz dives into the ways that Jews have tried to find a home in larger society, and the ways in which we have struggled to be accepted. This book is so interesting, we are doing a book club conversation about it at Valley in March!

### 4. *Morality: Restoring the Common Good in Divided Times*

by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks

The last book he wrote before his death, Morality is Rabbi Jonathan Sacks' attempt to make sense of the reality of the world of the early 2020s, and to try to implement some of the ethical underpinnings of Judaism to fight back. Prioritizing the "we" culture over the "I," Sacks tries to speak to the complex realities that got us here, and what we can do to overcome our situation.

### 5. *Have A Little Faith* by Mitch Albom

Part biography of two faith leaders, part spiritual awakening, Have a Little Faith is a beautiful examination of the role religion can play in our lives, and the vital importance of clergy who can show us the way. I have read this book every year since I was a teenager, and I cry every time. It is an ever-present reminder of how incredible it is to meet your heroes, especially when they are exactly as admirable as we imagined.





### BRING DONATIONS TO THE BLUE BIN IN THE TEMPLE LOBBY

As we have in the past several years, we will be supporting Sweet Cheeks Diaper Bank for the months of February and March.



Sweet Cheeks is part of "COVERD" of Greater Cincinnati, and of the National Diaper Bank Network. According to the Network: "1 in 2 U.S. families with young children cannot afford enough diapers to keep their infant or child clean, dry, and healthy. These babies are more vulnerable to painful rashes and urinary tract infections and have more trips to the doctor. 1 in 4 parents miss work or school because they can't afford the diapers required to leave their baby in Childcare. Clean diapers are a basic need of every baby and toddler."

In 2024, Sweet Cheeks worked with 44 partner agencies to distribute over 2.5 million diapers to over 4 thousand children per month. Help us keep the next generation dry, clean, and healthy by donating diapers and wipes to our Blue Bin!

Because they purchase a large percentage of the diapers they distribute, another way to contribute is to send money to the Valley Temple Social Action Fund, or by using the QR code to donate directly to Sweet Cheeks.



### Queen City Kitchen:

Another huge part of our Social Action work is providing lunch four times a year, approximately 40-50 meals, to individuals and families at Queen City Kitchen in Walnut Hills. Food is provided by temple members and money from our social action fund, and volunteers serve the meals. Upcoming dates are:

### SOCIAL JUSTICE ACTIVITIES

We work closely throughout the year with the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism (RAC). RAC is the Social Action arm of the Union of Reform Judaism (URJ) and the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR). RAC works to educate, inspire, and mobilize around federal, state, provincial, and local legislation on more than 70 pressing socioeconomic issues, including gun violence prevention, immigration, reproductive rights, criminal justice reform, LGBTQ rights, and climate change. Ohio is one of 7 states, plus Washington DC, to have a RAC affiliate. For RAC-OH, the key issues we've mobilized around for the past year were reproductive rights and fair elections.

**THE RAC WEBSITE REMINDS US:** "As Jews, we believe that all people are made in the image of God, and each of us is holy and sacred. As Reform Jews, we believe that caring for the most marginalized members of our communities is part of tikkun olam, repairing the world." Current campaigns include "Advocating for Immigration Justice" and "Advocating for LGBTQ+ Rights". You'll also find Reform movement statements on Gaza and the West Bank in Israel.


